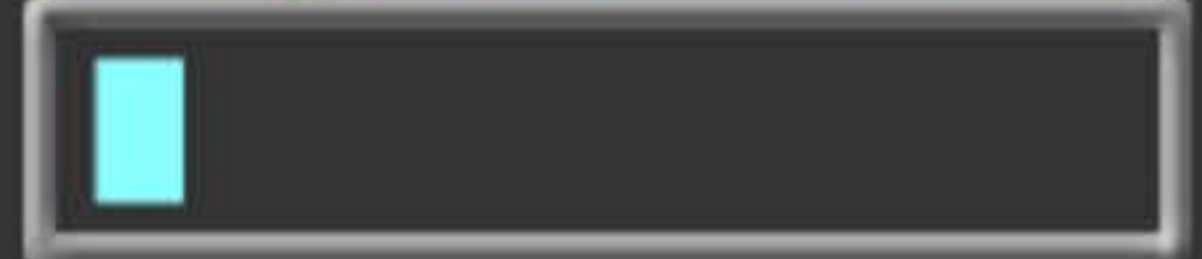

32. Winning the Shopping Spree

Two electronics stores are advertising a chance to win a shopping spree to buy video games. Store A claims that all its prizes will have a mean (average) value of \$110. Store B claims that all its prizes have the same mean value as Store A.

Liam knows both stores have great video games, and that's what he'll buy if he wins. A raffle ticket will cost \$10 at either store, and each store will have five money prizes to give away. Liam can afford to enter only one raffle.

Ben warns Liam that he should find out the amounts of the five prizes at each store before he buys his ticket.

The charts below show the prizes each store will award.
