

This color is red. In the first row the tomatoes are red. Trace the circle.




A triangle is a shape that has three sides and three corners.









Triangles can be large or small. Find an attribute block to fit each triangle. Trace and color it to match your block.











Draw a circle around each triangle.

Find an attribute block that matches the colored one. Move the block to the other shapes. If the block fits, color it to match. If it does NOT fit, color the shape red.



Trace the line from the shape to the group in which it belongs. Then draw a line from each shape to the group in which it belongs.


