A-178	Alike: Both have roots, branches, and leaves. Both are generally smaller than trees. Different: A bush is typically low and spreading; a vine is typically long and thin.	
A-179	Alike: Both are wastes that must be collected and disposed of. Different: Garbage refers to food waste; trash refers to product (metal, paper, plastic, etc.) waste.	
A-180	Alike: Both refer to possession of something that belongs to someone else. Different: Borrow suggests intent to return an item to its owner; steal doesn't. Borrowing is legal; stealing isn't.	
A-181	Alike: Both concern the sending and receiving of information. Different: A signal primarily conveys directional or factual information; an alarm primarily warns or alerts.
